ohayō gozaimasu ( <i>oh hi yoh-- go zah ee mas</i> )	good morning
konnichiwa ( <i>kohn knee chee wah</i> )	hello
sayōnara ( <i>sah yoh-- nah rah</i> )	good bye
arigatō gozaimasu ( <i>ah ree gah toe--go zah ee mas</i> )	thank you

### In School

gakkō ( <i>gah koh--</i> )	school
sensei ( <i>sen say</i> )	teacher
yoku dekimashita ( <i>yoh coo deh key mah shta</i> )	well done!

### In the House

tatami ( <i>tah tah me</i> )	floor mats
tokonoma ( <i>toe koh no mah</i> )	alcove
shoji ( <i>show jee</i> )	white paper doors
fusuma ( <i>foo sue mah</i> )	heavy paper doors

Honshu ( <i>hone shoe</i> )	main island, largest island
Shikoku ( <i>she koh coo</i> ), Kyushu ( <i>cue shoe</i> )	the two smaller southern islands
kimono ( <i>key moh no</i> ), tabi ( <i>tah bee</i> ), zori ( <i>zoh ree</i> )	silk traditional clothing, white socks, footwear
